

SAINTS COMMUNITY PROJECT

Saints (Brackley) Community Trust was set up some five years ago; it is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation, and it is able to apply for funding towards projects that promote community cohesion.

Because Brackley Town plays in the National League, the charity is able to apply to the National League Trust, and that is its principal source of income. We are extremely grateful to the NLT for their continued support.

The charity also benefits from other funding. Some of it comes via the Northamptonshire Community Foundation and we get some from West Northamptonshire Council (so many thanks to all local Council Taxpayers!). Additionally, we enjoy support from local and national businesses (Waitrose, Beautifully Different, Howdens and DHL to name but a few).

PROJECT



The charity's principal focus is the Saints Community Project: an "open to all" coffee morning at the club every Wednesday morning with the option of an added-on home cooked lunch. There is regularly entertainment and well over 100 people come along every week. It provides a warm and welcoming space for all, and it is especially valuable to those who live alone and may otherwise experience isolation.

Only last week Valentine's Day was celebrated with a performance by the Lee Malvern Four, a mega-raffle and a distribution of heart-shaped chocolates and shortbread biscuits.

The project has also provided a home for a recent Cost of Living Roadshow organised by WNC which saw six different agencies set up stalls at The Venue for on-the-spot and ad hoc advice and support on a number of issues: energy, debt

advice, healthcare signposting to name but three. Saints (Brackley) Community Trust is currently also supporting a project, again with funding from the National League Trust, whereby a member of the football club staff is visiting primary schools that often have no male teachers or assistants to offer a male role model to some of the children: this may be to read, to talk, to play or just to listen. This is ongoing and it is proving very welcome and very successful.
